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3.            for comprehension. If your professor has indicated that some chapters are less important than others you will want to set your priorities accordingly. Clues in the text, such as            headings, and text in            print will help you to select important information. Make connections between the sections that you are reading. It may be helpful for you to form visual images if this is a strategy that helps you to learn and remember. Choose a method of recording key information that works best for you. Some methods include underlining or highlighting, making brief notes in the margin, developing diagrams, making up test questions, and listing key words.
  4.            after you've read a section. Ask yourself questions about the material you've just read. Rephrase the material into your own words in written form (make notes) as this will help you to better remember what you have read.
  5.            your textbook notes withi
